AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

**Food Service Facilities – Suspension or Nonrenewal of Licenses –
Multiple or Unpaid Citations Related to Public Health, etc.**

FOR the purpose of authorizing the suspension or nonrenewal of a license for a food service facility that has received multiple environmental or civil citations or is in default of an environmental or civil citation issued for reasons related to public health; specifying certain offenses presumed to be related to public health; requiring notice and an opportunity to be heard; and generally relating to the licensing and regulation of food service facilities.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

1 § 6-603.1. SUSPENSION OR NONRENEWAL FOR MULTIPLE OR UNPAID CITATIONS.

2 (A) *IN GENERAL.*

3 THE COMMISSIONER MAY SUSPEND OR REFUSE TO RENEW THE LICENSE OF A FOOD SERVICE
4 FACILITY IF:

5 (1) AT ANY TIME WITHIN THE PRECEDING 6 MONTHS, THE FACILITY HAS BEEN SERVED
6 WITH 3 OR MORE CITATIONS ISSUED FOR REASONS RELATED TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR
7 TO THE PREVENTION OF DISEASE, EPIDEMICS, OR NUISANCES AFFECTING PUBLIC
8 HEALTH, UNDER EITHER OR BOTH OF:

9 (i) CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 40 {"ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL
10 BOARD"}; OR

11 (ii) CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 41 {"CIVIL CITATIONS"}; OR

12 (2) AT ANY TIME WITHIN THE PRECEDING 12 MONTHS, THE FACILITY HAS BEEN
13 DECLARED TO BE IN DEFAULT OF 1 OR MORE CITATIONS ISSUED FOR REASONS
14 RELATED TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR TO THE PREVENTION OF DISEASE, EPIDEMICS, OR
15 NUISANCES AFFECTING PUBLIC HEALTH, UNDER EITHER OF:

19 BEFORE SUSPENDING OR REFUSING TO RENEW A LICENSE UNDER THIS SECTION, THE
20 COMMISSIONER MUST PROVIDE THE FACILITY WITH NOTICE AND AN OPPORTUNITY FOR
21 HEARING, AS PROVIDED IN TITLE 2, SUBTITLE 3 {"ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS"} OF THIS
22 ARTICLE.

23 **§ 6-604. Reinstatement of suspended licenses.**

24 (c) *Required reinstatement.*

25 If, on reinspection, the facility is found to comply with all APPLICABLE requirements [of
26 this title], the license must be reinstated.

27 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
28 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
29 Ordinance.

30 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
31 after the date it is enacted.
